We present to you the next issue of our journal, dedicated to pressing issues of public law. They are examined from multiple perspectives – ranging from legal theory and philosophy of law, through the lens of international and EU law, all the way to analytical dogmatic-legal deliberations rooted in highly current social problems.

The articles were written by twenty-seven Authors from twenty-two universities and research institutes.
